Assignment Title: Republic of Serbia - Collection of Baseline Information on Justice Sector Service Delivery

Assignment Country: Serbia

Assignment Description

The World Bank intends to finance the assignment/services described below under the Serbia Multi-Donor Trust Fund for Justice Sector Support (MDTF-JSS). The Republic of Serbia is making efforts to accelerate its EU integration. The World Bank-executed MDTF-JSS aims to facilitate Serbia's EU integration process and provide analytical, policy and capacity-building support to its justice sector reform and modernization efforts. As a first step, baseline information will be collected using surveys and other information gathering techniques to benchmark Serbia's performance on different aspects of service delivery relevant to the justice sector. A Consultant is expected to design, implement and analyze results of the diagnostic baseline surveys and other information gathering tools targeting four groups of respondents: (i) public officials working in the justice sector; (ii) enterprise managers from the private sector; (iii) members of the legal profession providing services to the general public and business community; (iv) the general public. Qualified Consultants should possess (i) proven expertise and capacity in design and implementation of large scale data collection exercises – from sampling strategy and instrument design to data analysis and report writing; (ii) proven experience in successfully conducting large scale socio-economic surveys in the field; and (iii) a well established country-wide network of enumerators and a fully-staffed call center. The duration of the assignment – from signing the contract to submission of the final reports – shall not exceed 8 (eight) months. The World Bank now invites eligible consultants to indicate their interest in providing the services. Interested consultants must provide information indicating that they are qualified to perform the services (brochures, description of similar assignments, experience in similar conditions, availability of appropriate skills among staff, etc.). Consultants may associate to enhance their qualifications.
